We would like to begin by congratulating all students for their dedication and hard work throughout this term.

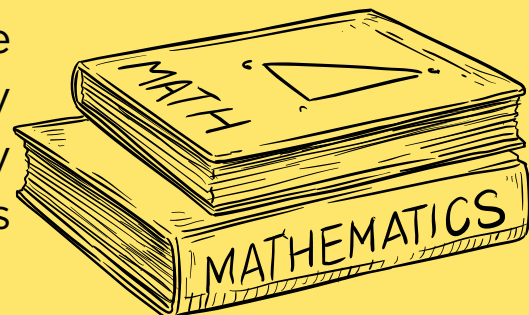
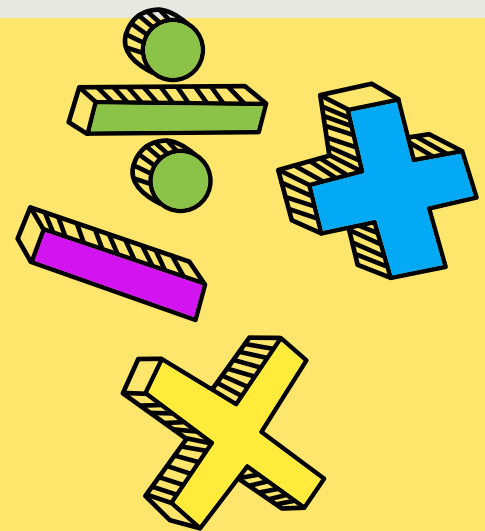
We also extend our heartfelt thanks to parents and guardians for their ongoing support, which plays a vital role in helping our students succeed in their learning.

Year 8 exams will take place during weeks 29 and 30.



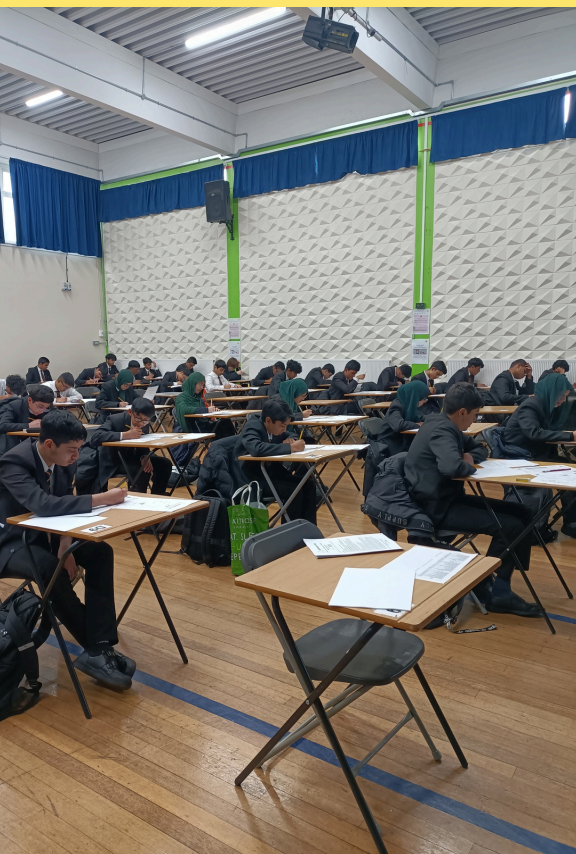
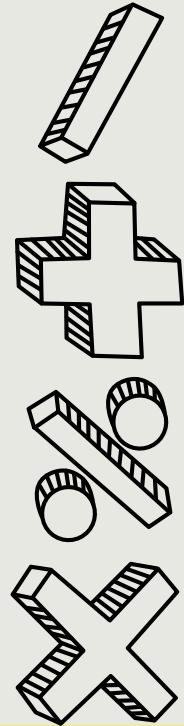

Exam Preparation for Years 11-13

With A-Level and GCSE exams fast approaching, it is crucial that students plan their revision effectively to achieve the best possible results.

Many of our top-performing students begin their revision early, giving themselves plenty of time to prepare thoroughly.

We strongly recommend that students create a detailed revision timetable and allocate regular time to Maths revision, including over the Easter holidays.



To further support students in their preparation, the Maths Department will offer revision classes during the first week of the Easter holiday. Please ask your child for the intervention timetable.

Additionally, all students will receive a pack of past papers, which they can use both in lessons and at home. Practicing past papers is one of the most effective ways to revise, as it helps students familiarise themselves with the types of questions they may encounter and improve their exam technique.

Further revision materials are also available through Microsoft Teams, which students can access at their convenience.

Equipment for Exams

It is essential that students are fully equipped for their exams. Each student should have two black pens, a ruler, a pencil, and a scientific calculator.

For A-Level Maths students, an advanced scientific calculator is required, and for Further Maths students, a graphical calculator is needed. Ensuring that students have the correct equipment will help them feel confident and well-prepared on exam day.

Why is reading at home important?

Book Recommendations



Research shows that students who read books regularly perform better at school and make more academic progress across the curriculum.

According to a recent study from the National Literacy Trust, twice as many children and young people who enjoy reading in their free time have above average reading skills.

Reading improves students' cognitive skills such as comprehension, memory, and critical thinking.

It also develops their imagination and creativity which are essential for achieving academic success in their exams.

Students will expand their vocabulary by frequently reading books and other resources.

Reading regularly will help students become more knowledgeable about the world.

ENGLISH LITERACY NEWS

How can parents encourage their child to read at home?

Encourage your child to read a wide range of fiction and non-fiction books including articles. For example, novels, newspapers, biographies, autobiographies, and magazines.

You may encourage them to read books focused on topics that they enjoy such as football, sports, science, mystery, adventure, and history.

Talk about books. Engage your child in book discussions about their favourite characters and books. Share your favourite books with your child. This could inspire them to emulate your positive reading habits.

Utilise electronic devices such as kindles and audiobooks to help your child access other useful online reading resources.

You could also use subtitles/captions on the television to help your child develop their pronunciation of specific words.

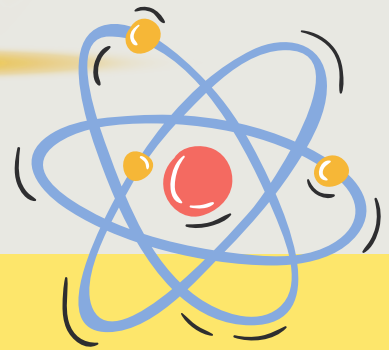

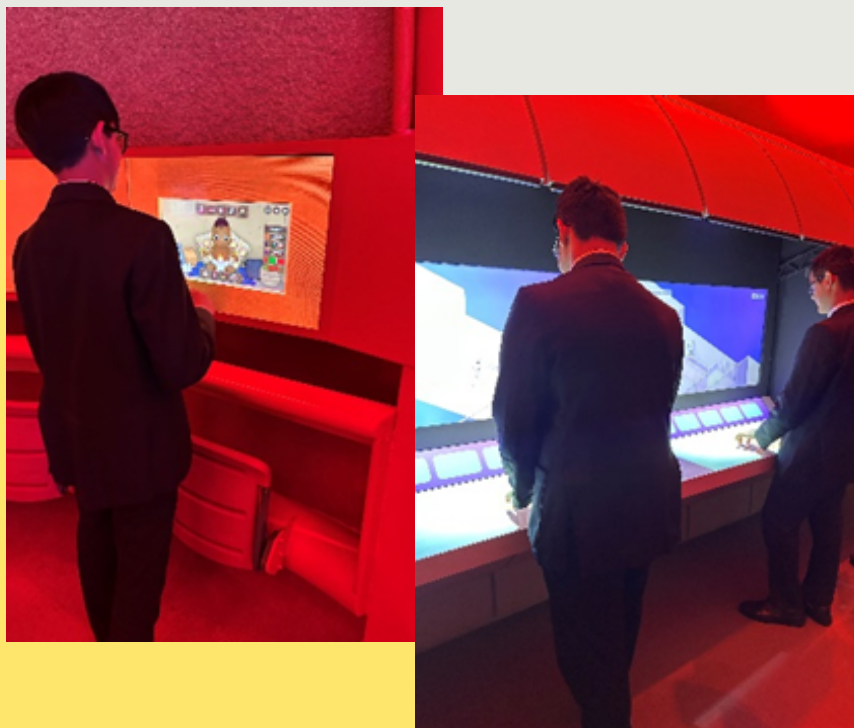


SCIENCE FACULTY NEWS

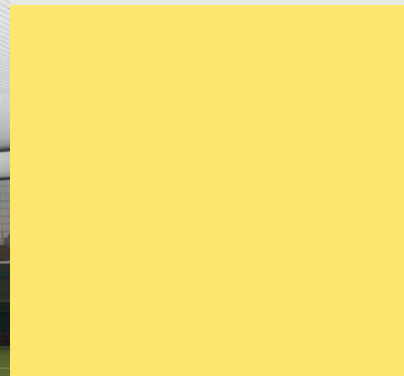
🏆 Year 13 BTEC Sport: Intra-Form Football Tournament Success! ⚽

Preparing for post-16 life

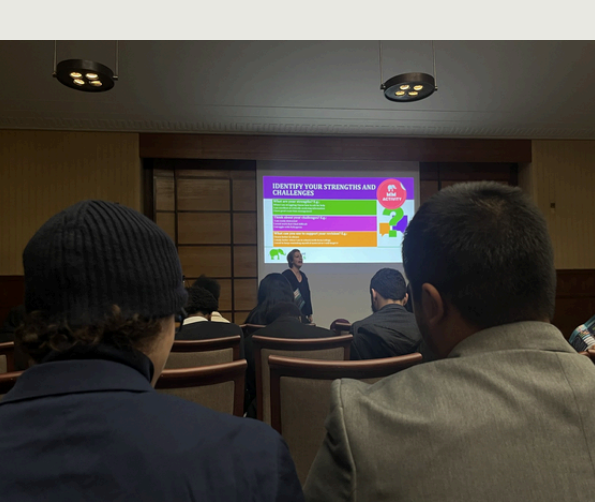


Why not come join us?

As we approach the crucial exam period, I would like to provide you with important updates regarding Year 13 and Year 12 A Level English students, as well as those preparing for their GCSE English Language retakes. Year 13 – Revision and Upcoming Exams

Year 13 students are now in the final stages of their A Level English Literature course and are actively revising for their **AP3 assessments** and their final **A Level exams**. The key dates for their examinations are as follows:

- **Paper 1:** Tuesday, 14th May 2025
- **Paper 2:** Wednesday, 22nd May 2025

In addition, students have now completed their **NEA (Non-Exam Assessment)**, which has been finalised and will be sent off at the end of this term. This is an important component of their final grade.
